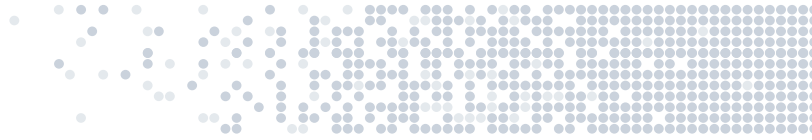

BACKGROUND

The registered provider commenced as an RTO in 1993 as an explosives training organisation in the transport and distribution industry for dangerous goods. In 1998 the registered provider changed names to AITC, the registered providers training focus is the mining, quarrying, aviation and construction industries for the delivery and assessment of high risk and licenced qualifications and units of competency.

RTO Management structure

The RTO has a CEO with an operations manager, admin manager, which reports to the CEO on a daily operational basis. The management structure of the RTO is a flat management structure.

Other strategic & operational groups that assist the RTO

The CEO is a member of the national safety council, Victorian Dangerous Goods Advisory Group, Fire Protection Association, VELG, Tranz Net, and the Australasian Institute of Dangerous goods.

The registered provider’s evidence did not demonstrate that the RTO’s training and assessment strategies and practices, including the amount of training they provide, are consistent with the requirements of training packages and VET accredited courses and enable each learner to meet the requirements for each unit of competency or module in which they are enrolled because:

- The RTO is delivering full qualifications, as well as separate licenced high risk units of competency, whilst the training and assessment strategies for the full qualifications identify core and elective components in accordance with the structure defined by the relevant training package, the defined elective units or modules being offered exceed the training package recommended packaging rules without an explanation why.

- The registered provider's training and assessment strategy does not demonstrate that the assessment methods will confirm consistency and accuracy of performance (over time and in a range of workplace relevant contexts) together with the application of required skills and knowledge, because the training and assessment strategy does not identify how the RTO will collect assessment evidence to satisfy the requirements of each unit of competency assessed.
- There was no reference to how assessment decisions will be formulated from multiple sources of assessment evidence across different methods and or tasks in relation to clustered units of competency, including RPL assessment, the relevant training package states:
- The registered providers training and assessment strategy/s do not identify if any of the units of competency are clustered for delivery and assessment purposes.
- The registered provider's training and assessment strategies did not specify all of the resources, both human and physical, that will be used to meet the requirements of the qualification/course/unit of competency.
- The training and assessment strategy does not identify the locations where training will be delivered and assessment will be conducted.
- The Training & Assessment Strategy has not identified entrance pre enrolment/enrolment requirements: e.g. minimum education standard, industry skills, knowledge, & experience, legislative, regulatory requirements e.g. medical restrictions/requirements, any age restrictions i.e. under 18 year olds cannot be enrolled in high risk licenced course/qualification.

The registered provider's evidence did not demonstrate that the amount of training provided to each learner is determined for the existing skills, knowledge and experience of learners, and the mode/s of delivery because:

- The training and assessment strategy/s do not analyse the nature of the learner cohort and, in conjunction with the specific requirements of the training product, and regulatory licence requirements, e.g. the level of existing skills, knowledge and experience of learners to determine how the RTO will schedule training and assessment activities to ensure learners are able to fully develop the required skills and knowledge prior to being assessed.
- The registered provider does not identify variations in the time to deliver training demonstrating it has analysed the nature of the learner cohort taking into consideration their levels of experience and current levels of identified skills and knowledge.
- The registered provider's Training and Assessment strategies did not identify how the training and assessment is to be delivered—face-to-face, online, through workplace training or a mixture of different modes.

In order to become compliant, the organisation is required to:

- Demonstrate that the sampled training and assessment strategies have been amended to show the identified non-compliances have been rectified, and the sampled training and assessment strategies meet the requirements of the clause.
