



**Student Information about Industry Licences, Tickets, and Qualifications**

Thank you for choosing to train with us.

AITAC has specialised in training for Industry Tickets and Regulator Licences for more than 20 years. These include Dangerous Goods and Explosives across multiple industries, Rigging, Scaffolding, Cranes and a wide range of plant and equipment used in Construction, Extraction and Agriculture. All of these Licences or Tickets are included in formal Qualifications or in industry Skill Sets endorsed by the Education and Safety Regulators in every state and territory.

Industry is currently seeking qualified people to fill vacancies in Transport, Warehousing, Construction, Resources and Agriculture.

The number of vacancies and the remuneration for these positions changes with each year but the general 5 year projections from the federal government have been provided for your information.

While AITAC does not imply that we can get you a job or a different position, we believe that an increase in qualifications and skills goes hand in hand with better, more rewarding jobs and better pay. This also helps to put you ahead in the competition to get the job you want, because it makes you a more attractive applicant to the employer.

The federal and state governments are currently providing eligible students with some generous incentives to take up training in formal Qualifications:

The Victorian government is offering substantial subsidies for training towards a formal Qualification.

AITAC has current approval from the Victorian Education Department via the Skills First Program to offer subsidised training in the fields of Rigging, Scaffolding, Mobile Cranes, Driver Training, and Driving Operations. These subsidies are available to students who meet specific eligibility criteria, and information about this is available on the Skills First website at:

In the interests of full disclosure, AITAC points out that there are some courses under TAFE initiatives which might be free or better suited for your circumstances.

AITAC also offers other courses of study which are charged as full fee for service.

Alternatively, if you are employed and seeking to get a Qualification, you may be eligible to take up a Traineeship via your employer. This is done through government approved agents (not just directly through RTOs).

industry Licences and Tickets are typical subjects or Units which help to make up the full qualifications that AITAC offers.

If you enrol in a Qualification, you are in charge.

- You can schedule your training to meet your individual needs - courses are run over weekends, RDOs, and evenings — you don't have to lose pay to attend.
- We have many online offerings which allow you to study at your own pace, then focus your time with us on gaining practical skills.
- You can change the units you wish to complete, or even change the selected qualification.
- it is your training program, and it is up to you how it is achieved.
- You can also combine refresher training and Verification of Competency assessments into your qualification.

Skills you already have will be credited against the qualification via Recognition of Prior Learning.

We will inform you who will conduct your training and all other details as soon as we possibly can. Often you can select your preferred Trainer when you book into a scheduled course.

Study **at your own pace**, online or face-to-face. Attend any **public** course. It is your choice.
